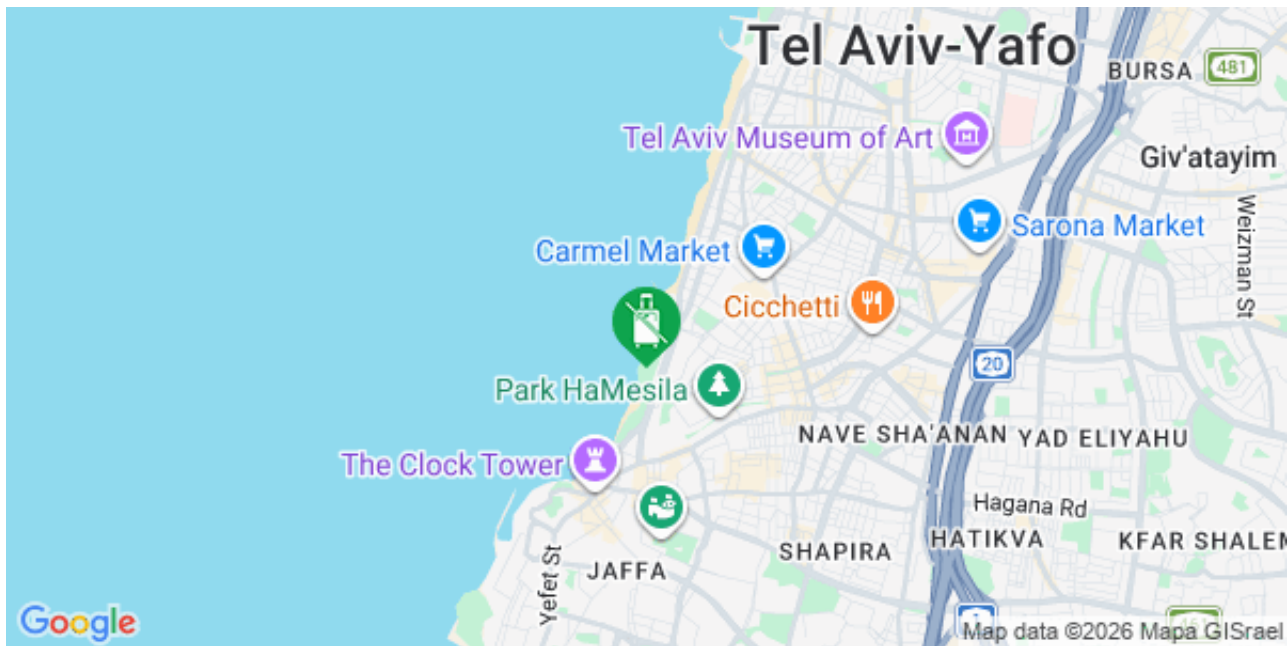

Israel Tactical: Tel Aviv Pride Parade to be held along Shlomo Lahat Promenade from 12:00 on June 12; allot for disruptions

Current Situation:

- The **Tel Aviv-Jaffa** Municipality announced that the 2026 Pride Parade will take place from 12:00 (local time) on June 12. The event will start at **Gordon Beach**, proceed along the **Shlomo Lahat Promenade** for approximately 2.5 km, and conclude at **Charles Clore Park**, where related Pride events will take place.
- Authorities announced several traffic and parking restrictions ahead and during the event and advised participants to travel via public transportation:
 - Parking will be prohibited along parts of HaYarkon, Gordon, Herbert Samuel, and Kaufman Streets, as well as adjacent roads, from 16:00 on June 11 until 20:00 on June 12.
 - From 06:30 on June 12, vehicle traffic will be prohibited on sections of Herbert Samuel, HaYarkon, and Frishman Streets. Additional road closures affecting parts of HaYarkon, Kaufman, and Allenby Streets, as well as adjacent roads in central and southern Tel Aviv, will take effect from 08:00.

- Authorities also prohibited entry into the area with weapons, sharp objects, animals, two-wheeled vehicles, bicycles, or scooters.

Assessments & Forecast:

1. The Tel Aviv Pride Parade is one of the most well-attended annual events in Israel, and has historically attracted tens of thousands of participants, with attendance exceeding 100,000 in some years.
2. On May 31, Police Commissioner Danny Levy announced that Israel Police would do “everything necessary” to ensure the parade transpired peacefully, and to mitigate “manifestations of violence, incitement, hatred, or harm of any kind.”
3. **FORECAST:** The slated parade is expected to draw a turnout in the high tens of thousands to the low hundreds of thousands. A heightened security presence is anticipated to deter potential threats, spoil actors, or harassers.
4. **FORECAST:** Participants are liable to display anti-government messaging, including criticism of the government’s policies toward the LGBTQ+ community and broader political issues. Nonetheless, the event is likely to transpire peacefully, although localized unrest and isolated incidents targeting participants cannot be ruled out.
5. **FORECAST:** Significant traffic disruptions are likely along the Tel Aviv promenade and in surrounding areas due to the announced extensive road closures. Disruptions to vehicular and pedestrian movement are likely between June 11 and 12.

Recommendations:

1. Those operating or residing in Tel Aviv from the afternoon hours on June 11 and the evening hours of June 12 are advised to allot for disruptions in the vicinity of the Shlomo Lahat Promenade and Charles Clore Park due to the Pride Parade and associated traffic and security measures.
2. Remain cognizant of the potential for localized, isolated instances of violence between participants and anti-LGBTQ+ protesters.
