Europe Tactical: Protests for International Women's Day to take place regionwide on March 7-8; maintain heightened vigilance

Current Situation

• On March 7-8, feminist protests will be held in multiple cities regionwide to commemorate International Women's Day on March 8. These protests have been organized by women's rights, left-wing, pro-Palestinian, and trade union groups. Many organizers have also called upon women to stage general strike actions. Details of these protests can be found below:

- In Vienna, **Austria**, a feminist rally will be held at Platz der Menschenrechte from 10:00 (local time) on Marcbach 8.
- The protest is organized by feminist organization Osterreichischen Frauenrings, and is expected to include female representatives from multiple political parties. Police have stated that disruptions to pedestrian and vehicular traffic are expected from the morning hours.

- In Brussels, **Belgium**, a feminist protest will be held at the Kuntsberg, or Mont des Arts, from 14:00 on March 8.
- The protest is organized by the feminist and left-wing Bloc Revolutionnaire Internationnaliste et Feministe group, and is being held to promote "anti-imperialism, anti-racism, anti-capitalism".

- An additional protest in Brussels will be held at Boulevard de l'Empereur 36 1000 Brussels from 14:30 on March 8.
- The protest is organized by the civil society group Golem Belgique along with multiple associations and collectives to denounce restrictions on women's rights.

• In Sofia, **Bulgaria**, a protest will be held at the Court House from 16:00 on March 8. The protest will denounce patriarchal violence, economic exploitation, and war. The protest is organized by civil society group Feminist Mobilisations.

- In Helsinki, **Finland**, a protest march will be held from Senate Square, via Mannerheimintie to Kansalaistori Square from 14:00 on March 8.
- The protest is organized by the feminist group Naisjarjestojen Keskusliitto, UN Women Finland, and the Union of Women's Affairs. The protest is being held to advocate for continued work towards gender equality in Finland.

- In Paris, **France**, a protest march will be held from Place de Republique to Place de Madeline from 14:00 on March 8. The exact protest route is not available as of writing.
- The protest is organized by the feminist association Greve Feministe will hold, and supported by multiple organizations, including the far-left political party La France Insoumise (LFI).

• Greve Feministe has also called for a strike in "work, domestic chores, and consumption" on March 8.

- The protest is organized by Confederation Generale du Travail (CGT), Confederation Francaise Democratique du Travail (CFDT), Union Nationale des Syndicats Autonomes (UNSA), Union Syndicale Solidaires, and Federation Syndicale Unitaire (FSU), in coordination with feminist organizations, to demand gender equality and labor rights.

- In the Massy suburb of Paris, **France**, a protest march will be held from 14 Rue de Chermin des Femmes from 19:00 on March 7. The exact protest route is not available as of writing.
- The protest has been organized by multiple feminist and pro-Palestinian organizations, including pro-Palestinian organization Samidoun, feminist group Solidaires 91, and others.

- In Berlin, Germany, a feminist demonstration will be held at Oranienplatz from 12:30 on March 8.
- The protest has been organized by multiple feminist organizations and trade unions, including the education and science union Gewerkschaft Erziehung und Wissenschaft Berlin and Deutschen Gewerkschaftsbundes Berlin-Brandenburg. It aims to denounce austerity policies and their impact on social programs helping women.

The march will proceed via Oranienstrasse, Axel-Springer-Strasse, and Leipziger Strasse to the final desination at Rotes Rathaus. The protest is organized by Bundnis fur sexuelle Selbstbestimmung and Verdi union to demand women's rights and social justice.

• In Cologne, **Germany**, a protest associated with International Women's Day will be held at Wiener Platz from 13:30 on March 8.

• The protest is organized by multiple feminist and left-wing organizations, including Turkish antifascist group Yeni Kadin, the communist Marxist-Leninist Party of Germany, Turkish left-wing group "Young Struggle", and feminist group Frauen Kollektiv. - The protest is organized by the March 8 Committee under the slogan "Welfare, Not Warmongering." It will focus on demands for peace, social justice, and economic equality.

- In Malmo, **Sweden**, a protest march will be held from Gustav Adolf Torg to Mollevangstorget from 14:30 on March 8.
- The protest is organized by the left-wing political party Vansterpartiet Malmo and Ung Vanster under the slogan "Every Woman Has the Right to Life." It aims to highlight the violence and oppression faced by women globally.

- The protest is organized by the Ethiopian Refugee Association in Sweden to raise awareness about violence against Ethiopian women, particularly during recent conflicts.

- The protest is organized by the March 8 Committee under the slogan "International Sisterhood Your Fight is My Fight." The demonstration is being held to oppose gender-based violence and advocate for women's rights worldwide.

- The demonstration, titled "Take Back the Night," is organized by SUF Stockholm (Syndikalistiska Ungdomsforbundet Stockholm), Allt at Alla Stockholm, Allt at Alla Kvinnofront, and TransHub to denounce gender-based violence in public spaces.

- In London, **UK**, a protest will be held by feminist and pro-Palestinian groups in Gandalf's Corner in Regent Park from 15:00 on March 8.
- The protest is organized by the feminist Latin American Women's Aid organization, and aims to denounce violence against women, particularly against Latin American women, in the UK.

 An additional protest held by the feminist group Million Women Rise will take place in London, with an initial gathering at Duke Street at 12:00 on March 8. The protest march will proceed through Oxford Street, Regents Street, and Piccadilly Circus prior to the final rally location at Trafalgar Square.

- Separately in London, a protest will be held at the Chinese Embassy on 49-51 Portland Place from 15:00 on March 8.
- The demonstration is organized by multiple feminist and advocacy groups, including Workers Against CCP, Hong Kong Labour Rights Monitor, Taiwan Democracy, Democracy 4 Hong Kong, and Women's Fightback. It aims to demand freedom for women political prisoners in China and Hong Kong, including feminists, labor activists, and democracy advocates.

- In Edinburgh, **UK**, a protest march will take place from High Street to the Scottish Parliament from 13:00 on March 8. The exact protest route is not available as of writing.
- The protest is organized by International Women's Day Edinburgh (IWDE) and aims to focus on women's bodily autonomy and the "rise in fascism".

Asessments & Forecast

- 1. Based on past years, the demonstrations are likely to draw turnouts ranging in the mid-hundreds to mid-tens-of-thousands each, with protests in France, Germany, Poland, and Spain, likely to draw the largest turnouts. Protests are also expected in other urban centers regionwide on March 7-8.
- 2. While most of these demonstrations are expected to transpire largely peacefully, protests involving pro-Palestinian groups and far-left groups carry a latent for unrest. Any such unrest is likely to manifest in the form of localized clashes between protesters, potential counterprotesters, and the police. As such, a bolstered security presence is liable to be deployed in the vicinity of the protest locations as a precautionary measure. In the event of escalating unrest, the police are likely to respond with forcible crowd control measures, including conducting arrests and deploying tear gas.
- 3. Significant disruptions to pedestrian and vehicular traffic, including possible road closures, can be anticipated in the vicinity of the protest locations throughout March 7-8.
- 4. Further, given calls for a general strike, there is also a latent potential for women to stage walkouts at their workplaces, resulting in disruptions to multiple sectors including transportation and healthcare.

Recommendations

 Those operating or residing in Europe on March 7-8 are advised to maintain heightened vigilance in the vicinity of all protests related to International Women's Day due to the latent potential for localized unrest Allot for traffic-related disruptions in the vicinity of protests regionwide.
