Europe Tactical (UPDATE): Protests related to Israel-Hamas conflict to take place in multiple cities on March 27-30; maintain heightened vigilance

Current Situation

- Reports indicate that protests related to the Israel-Hamas conflict will take place in several cities regionwide on March 27-30. Multiple protests are organized as part of International al-Quds Day. Details are as follows:
- In Brussels, **Belgium**, a pro-Palestinian protest is slated to take place at Place Fernand Cocq from 17:00 (local time) on March 27.

Assessments & Forecast

1. Based on precedent and the mobilizational capabilities of the organizers, pro-Palestinian protests are likely to attract turnouts ranging from the low to high thousands, with protests in Berlin and Paris likely attracting higher turnouts. Counter-demonstrations are likely to see lower turnouts in the low hundreds.
2. In addition to the planned protests, spontaneous pro-Palestinian and pro-Israel demonstrations are likely to occur regionwide on March 28-30, given heightened tensions over the renewed fighting in the Gaza Strip and commemorations of International al-Quds Day events. Protests over the conflict are likely to take place near central government buildings, main squares, and Israeli and US diplomatic missions.

3. Based on precedent, any planned or spontaneous demonstrations carry a heightened potential for unrest in the form of clashes between protesters, potential counter-protesters, and police. Further, the potential for pro-Israel counter-protests also remains, increasing the risk of clashes between opposing groups.
4. Additionally, protests with high student involvement or participation of radical groups, especially far-left pro-Palestinian groups, have a heightened risk of unrest, as these entities are liable to engage in disruptive tactics, such as blocking roads or damaging property. As such, the protests in Berlin and Munich pose a heightened risk of clashes with law enforcement, considering the involvement of student and left-wing groups. Similarly, any protests in connection with the UK student walkouts are at a heightened risk of unrest, given the involvement of student activist groups, which are liable to vandalize university property or attempt to disrupt campus proceedings.
5. Given this, a reinforced security presence is expected near protest locations to monitor proceedings. In the case of escalating unrest, police are liable to use forcible dispersal methods, including using tear gas or conducting mass arrests.
6. Significant disruptions to pedestrian and vehicular movement, including road closures, disruptions to public transportation, and traffic diversions, should be anticipated near the protest locations.

Recommendations

1. Those operating or residing in Europe on March 27-30 are advised to maintain heightened vigilance near protests related to the Israel-Hamas conflict due to the elevated potential for unrest.
2. Allot for travel-related disruptions in the vicinity of the protest locations.
